Draft of Cable to be sent to Rt. Hon. Earl Russell re Kennedy's Speech on Friday evening, March 2, 1962, on Resuming Nuclear Testing

Makers of American nuclear policies have all along been determined to resume testing. Since the first non-political conference, the United States has been merely manoeuvreing at Geneva with no intention of agreeing to a test ban. Kennedy's speech Friday evening confirms that additional nuclear tests in the atmosphere have always been the policy of the American government.

"We cannot make strides in our military preparations without testing bombs in the atmosphere as well as underground."


"Our progress is stifled without experiments in every department."
