Dear Dr. Brewster:

Harvard, Yale, Princeton, Cornell and Oxford are the famous universities in which Dean Acheson, Dulles, Rusk, Rogers and Kissinger were educated. These men are mainly responsible for our international policies, the cost of which "in human life and suffering are appalling".

I have known all of these men, starting with Dulles in 1912, and in the language of my old friend Andrew White, the first President of Cornell, I have considered them "blockheads and bullies".

Seven Great Statesmen

The joint statement deploring their policies that you and the heads of eight other universities issued on April 19 was most urgently needed. You have let America know that the alma maters of these graduates consider their policies to be discordant with the highest intellectual and ethical standards of our great institutions of learning.
