You may remember that in July of last year, following a public statement which was issued under my signature, and that of a number of my scientific colleagues, you very kindly offered to assist in promoting a meeting of scientists to study the consequences of the development of nuclear weapons:

Since that time, a number of individuals have expressed their interest in such a meeting, and after reflection, those of us who signed the original letter, found India to be the most suitable place. I enclose a copy of the invitation which we are sending out, so that you may see the general nature of our approach, and the list of persons who have been invited.

If the conference is to take place, it will be necessary to help some of those invited to find the costs of their journey; we estimate we shall need to raise by private donation, a sum of the order of £8,000. In view of the very kind offer which you made originally, I wondered whether you would be prepared to give us financial support. We should be most grateful for any assistance which you could give. I may add, that we hope that the conference in India is only a preliminary one, and may lead to something more important.
